WHAT DOES RESPECT LOOK LIKE?

Your youngster's daily dealings with adults and kids alike will be more pleasant if they speak and act respectfully.

Try these tips for helping him learn about respect.

RESPECTFUL REPLIES: Think about something that you and your youngster disagree on (say, whether their video game time should be limited). Model having a respectful discussion about it. You might say that his brain and body are growing and that they need to run and play to stay healthy and make their bones stronger. Then, suggest a respectful response, such as, "I want to be healthy, but I love video games." Have them brainstorm other situations where people have different opinions but still speak to each other with respect.

EVERYDAY ACTS: When you mow the lawn or clean up after your dog, you can teach your child about respect for neighbors. Explain that keeping your neighborhood clean and neat makes it nice for everyone. Ask him to think of other respectful things neighbors should do. If you share an apartment laundry room, they might say that you respect your neighbors' time by removing your clothes when done, so others get to use the washers and dryers.

DID YOU KNOW?

Children who regularly eat meals with their families tend to do better in school and avoid risky behavior. Eating dinner together is great, but other meals count, too. If you work at night, maybe you could make time for a family breakfast. Or, on a weekend, try a picnic lunch.

Eating together can be a time for conversation. Here are some conversation starters that may help you stay involved.

What is the coolest thing that happened to you today? On the other hand, what was not cool or good today? How were you kind or helpful to another person today?

Tell me what you learned about today, I learned, (share a small example), what about you?

What was the funniest thing you saw this week?


